National Organization

The National Association for Family and Community is organized with a Board consisting of a President, Vice President for Program, Vice President for Public Policy, Secretary, Treasurer and four Coordinators positions.

The purpose of National FCE is to oversee the organization as a whole. They also develop and teach lessons and presentations at the National FCE Conferences.

They also provide help to the State organizations as needed.

State Associations

The State Associations for Family and Community Education are organized with a State Board consisting of a President, one or two Vice Presidents, a Secretary, Treasurer and other various officers.

The purpose of the State Association is to oversee the operation of their state and to work with National FCE.



Districts

Districts usually consist of a District Director.

The purpose of the District Director is to work between the State Organization and the Counties within the District.

Counties

The Counties are usually organized with a President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

The County organization is to work with the State, the District Director and the Study Groups, Clubs or Units. They help coordinate lessons being taught, community service projects and other activities.

Study Groups, Clubs or Units

Study Groups, Clubs or Units are the small basic units of the FCE organization. They have officers, as needed, and members. These groups prepare and teach lessons, plan and do community service projects, and plan other activities for their groups.



Members

The most important part of the FCE organization is the members. These are the individuals that really make the organization go. They are people of all ages.

How do I sign up to join FCE?

- Obtain a membership form by contacting a member or officer of a local group, unit or club.
- Fill out the membership form and return it to the Treasurer of the group, unit, or club that you are joining through.
