Heritage Crafts – All classes taught in the Ballroom.

Scherenschnitte, old paper cutting: Ever since paper was discovered, paper cutting has been a folk art; starting in China (hua yang) and then wherever paper was used. We are most familiar with the Pennsylvania Dutch scherenschnitte. Make a greeting card and learn the basic steps in creating this fun craft. I will share examples of these paper crafts from around the world as we make the cards.

STANDING RULES FOR MARGARET SEIBOLD OREGON FCE STATE CONFERENCE SCHOLARSHIP

<u>PURPOSE</u>: The scholarship shall provide a partial payment of the cost attending the Annual Oregon FCE State Conference. The recipient may apply this to any expenses such as registration, travel, meals and motel costs.

<u>AMOUNT:</u> The amount and number of scholarships to be given will be determined by the Oregon FCE Board of Directors on a year to year basis.

ELIGIBILITY: The applicant must be a dues paying member of Oregon and National FCE. A person may receive the State Conference Scholarship as well as County and or local scholarships. An applicant may not receive the scholarship more than once in a five-year period. The award is not transferable

APPLICATION: The applicant will write a paragraph stating why she/he wants to be considered for the scholarship, what he/she hopes to gain from the conference and where, with whom and how the information will be shared with others. HOW AWARDED: The Margaret Seibold FCE Conference scholarship Committee will review the applicants and select the recipient(s). Questions may be addressed to the state Treasurer. The award will be in the form of a certificate and check given during the Conference.

WHEN DUE: Applications must postmarked or emailed no later than August 30 Scholarship recipients will be notified no later than September 15.

<u>ADMINISTRATOR:</u> The Oregon FCE State Treasurer will be responsible for maintaining a separate interest-bearing account and distribution of funds.

<u>POLICY CHANGE:</u> Rules governing this scholarship may be made by a vote of two-thirds of the Oregon FCE Board of Directors.

You will be required to fill out an evaluation sheet, which will be given to you with the check after the conference and submit to the treasure.

You must be registered for the complete conference to receive this scholarship
