LEADER'S GUIDE

Materials for Leaders

- Survey
- Outline of lesson
- Napkin folding booklet
- Napkin ring patterns and direction sheets
- Evaluation form
- Cloth napkins & paper napkins
- Small vases, wine & water glasses, napkin rings
- Assortment of "collectibles" for decorating
- Table cloth (bring one if one is not available at the meeting room)
- One or two dinner plates (paper will suffice)

Materials for Participants

- Survey
- Napkin folding booklet
- Napkin ring direction sheets
- Evaluation form

To prepare for the lesson, practice all of the folding directions in the booklet, cut out and construct several of the napkin rings from the direction sheet, and collect the items you will use to demonstrate "decorating tips." Arrange to have a tablecloth and cloth dinner napkins available. Bring in paper napkins, if they are not available also. Most of the folds are easier to perform if you have stiff napkins. Check out your napkins to see which ones are best for each type of fold. Certain folds require napkins that are perfectly square; have some of this type available, if possible. Some folds work with paper napkins; some do not. Note: the tablecloth is a luxury, not a necessity, as are the dinner plates. They do help to demonstrate the effectiveness of your decorations, however.

Page 2, One Napkin +...

LESSON OUTLINE

The objectives of this lesson are

- Participants will discover the collectibles they have to use for table decorations
- Participants will practice several types of napkin folds
- Participants will learn about the use of napkin rings for decorating

Activity #1

Survey: Give participants the *survey sheet and ask them to list the sets of small collectibles they have in their home. Ask them to list the tablecloths that they have also. (about 2 minutes) (*survey sheets in back of booklet)

Ask several participants to volunteer to share their list of collectibles. (about 5 minutes) Then talk about how these collectibles can be used to decorate the table for conversation as well as beauty. (about 3 minutes)

Activity #2

Ask how many participants have cloth napkins tucked away in drawers and laundry baskets. Ask how many get the napkins out and use them? How often? Demonstrate each of the folding techniques listed in the booklet, letting the participants practice each one before proceeding to the next one. (Practice only as many as you have time for.) (about 25 minutes)

Activity #3

Show the napkin rings that you have brought in. Talk about how they help to carry the decorating theme. Show the "bone-based" napkin rings that you have made. Talk about the different variations of this basic pattern. (about 5 minutes)

Summary: Summarize the lesson and repeat the objectives. (about 2 minute)

Evaluation

Hand out the evaluations. Ask each participant to fill one out and turn it in.




SOME NAPKIN FOLDING TECHNIQUES

THE SWIRL

- 1. Lay the napkin our flat.
- 2. Starting with one of the corners, roll the napkin up.
- 3. Bend the napkin in the middle and place it in a glass.









Roll several colored &/or patterned napkins in a swirl, fold as indicated and put them in a large goblet or vase as a centerpiece.

SIMPLICITY

- 1. Fold the napkin into quarters.
- 2. Turn up the bottom corner.
- 3. Fold into thirds.










THE AMERICANIA


- 1. Fold the napkin into quarters.
- 2. Fold the bottom and side Corners to the center.
- 3. Fold into thirds.
- 4. Slip through a napkin ring.







THE CONE

- 1. Fold the napkin in half.
- 2. Roll into a cone.
- 3. Fold the bottom point up.
- 4. Fold the bottom of the cone up to form a cuff, and stand the napkin upright.









Can be made with large paper napkins.






- 1. Fold napkin in forths,
- 2. Fold down the top flap as indicated.
- 3. Fold along dotted lines.
- 4. Fold down second flap.
- 5. Fold second flap along dotted line.
- 7. Fold napkin along dotted line, putting fold underneath.
- 8. Fold napkin along dotted Line.
- 9. Finished fold with silverware inside fold.




3. Fold down thesecond and third flaps and tuck them behind the first to make 3 equal bands.

4. Fold back the sides and lay the napkin flat



THE FLEUR-DE-LYS

- 1. Fold the napkin in half to form a triangle.
- 2. Fold the points to the rear along the dotted lines as shown.
- 3. Pleat the napkin right across from left to right.
- 4. Open out the pleats and arrange in a small glass or napkin ring.

THE BISHOP'S HAT

1. Fold the napkin in
half to form a triangle.

2. Fold the left and right
corners up to meet at
the top point, forming a
diamond.

3. Fold the bottom

about 1 in. at the top.

4. Fold the corner back

to the bottom edge.

5. Turn the napkin over

5. Turn the napkin over and bring each of the sides back, tucking one into the other.

6. Stand the napkin upright and tuck each of the flaps into the cuff.

THE VIKING HAT

1. Fold the napkin in half diagonally then fold comers A to B.


2. Fold 2 flaps marked A up to B.

3. Fold the two flaps marked A out to the dotted lines at B

4. Fold A to B ensuring that the fold falls along the bottom dotted line.


5. Fold bottom edge A along dotted line maked B, then tuck ends marked C around the back to make napkin stand up.


6. Finished fold.






- 1. Lay the napkin flat.
- 2. Fold edges A and C to center line B.
- 3. Crease as shown by dotted line.
- 4. Fold out the 4 corners diagonally.
- 5. Tightly roll from the top to the center line. Pleat the remainder.
- 6. Fold in half as shown.
- 7. Arrange in glass.






THE ASCOT TIE

- Fold the napkin in half diagonally.
 Fold the bottom edge up by one quarter twice.
- 3. Fold the sides over.
- 4. Turn the napkin over and lay it flat.





THE COCK'S COMB

1. Fold as indicated on dotted line.

2. Fold diagonally.

3. Turn napkin so that the points are away

from you Fold sides B along dotted line to meet at center A.

4. Turn points of B under.

5. Fold along the center line A and stand the napkin with fold uppermost

 Pull up the four pleats and arrange to produce finished fold.


Setting an attractive table is not a lost art. We just need to remind ourselves to do it. It costs nothing except a little effort.

Linens are made to be used. You may not have any napkin rings, but everyone has items around the house to use as napkin accents or ties. instead of buying flowers for a centerpiece, display some of your 'collectibles.'

Your efforts will stimulate conversation and provide interesting memories.

So take those napkins out of the drawers, gather some of your favorite things for centerpieces, and surprise your friends with a nicely decorated table.

1. Lay the napkin flat and fold along the dotted lines, bringing poins A to B.

2. Fold A to B. This will give a W effect if viewed from the end of the napkin.


3. Pleat the napkin making 2 in. pleats.

4. Hold the napkin at the bottom bringing points A and B together.

5. Open the pleats and pull down one side.

6. Turn the napkin around and repeat stage 5.

7. Open the pleats into a fan shape and stand on table.









AFTERNOON TEA


- 1. Fold napkin into quarters.
- 2. Turn up the bottom comer.
- 3. Fold into thirds.
- 4. Turn the napkin over and lay flat.












- THE ROSE

 1. Lay napkin flat and fold along dotted lines.

 2. Turn through 45 degree folds and fold along the dotted lines.


 3. Turn again and fold on dotted lines.
- Turn napkin over and fold on dotted lines.
 Napkin after stage 4.
 Place a cup over the points in the center.

- 7. Pull each of the 12 points gently away from underneath, taking opposite corners in turn.



THE CANDLE

- Lay napkin out as diamond.
 Fold as indicated on the
- dotted line.
- 3. Turn so that the fold is away from you.
- 4. Roll the napkin inwards from the right, tucking in the end to fasten.
- 5. Finished fold.
